

Albert M. Greenfield School Uniform Policy

Every student in Kindergarten thru 8th grade is expected to arrive at school in uniform.

This list is not exclusive and only lists examples.

Tops

- Colors: Navy, Light Blue, White
 - Can be with or without a collar.
- Exceptions: Greenfield logo shirts and the middle school Greenfield logo hoodie.
- Not Permitted: sleeveless or revealing tops; non-Greenfield logo hoodies.

Bottoms

- Colors: Navy, Khaki, Black
- **Type**: pants, skirts, shorts, dresses, leggings.
 - Pants must be at the waist and stay there.
 - Funky or colorful leggings require uniform shorts, skirt or dress over them.
- **Not Permitted**: jeans, shorts or pants with non-Greenfield logos, writing or designs (pants with white stripes are OK). Revealing or torn clothing.

Shoes

- Closed toed shoes only.
- No slides, flip flops, Crocs, Keens, sandals, slippers.

Outerwear

• Students may not wear jackets, coats, or hats inside the building during the school day.

Students shall have the right to dress in accordance with their stated gender identity and/or expression within the constraints of the school's dress code.



Cell Phones and Electronics Policy

It is Greenfield's policy that students should not have cell phones and electronics on their person during the school day.

- 1. All cell phones and electronic devices should be turned off and placed in student's bag or locker
- 2. If a student is found in possession of or using a cell phone or electronic device during the school day, it will be confiscated immediately by the teacher or staff member.
- 3. Any confiscated item will be taken to the main office.
- 4. 1st Infraction: The principal will return the item to a parent or guardian at their earliest convenience. A parent or guardian will be required to come to school to claim the item.
- 5. 2nd infraction: The principal will return the item to a parent or guardian at the end of the school year. The parent or guardian will be required to come to school to claim the item.

It is the student's responsibility to let his or her parent guardian know that a cell phone or electronic device has been confiscated.
