Uniform Policy

Our uniform policy is back in full effect you can access it here.

Cell Phones/ Electronics

Cell phones are not allowed during the school day as they are a distraction to learning. We recommend that students check their phones in with parents or caregivers prior to the start of the school day.

- ***APPLE WATCHES are not to be worn during the school day, they must be placed in a pocket, locker or book bag. Students caught wearing them will have them confiscated.
- ***Students may not have phones out for any reason during the school day.
- ***When students set foot on the school grounds phones/Airpods/electronic devices must be turned off and put away.

Homework

The purpose of homework is to encourage student self-discipline, independence, and responsibility; increase student achievement; and expand the curriculum. The type of homework assigned is determined by the grade level and teacher, and by the students' needs.

Homework is assigned Monday through Friday. Weekend homework assignments are encouraged in the middle school grades at the Greenfield School and may be assigned in the lower grades as needed. Long term assignments, reading logs, and projects are examples of possible weekend homework.

Homework is to be completed on time. Completion of homework assignments will be reflected in students' report card grades. The classroom teacher, on an individual basis, may provide extensions for homework assignments in case of extenuating circumstances.

Greenfield School students are expected to read, or be read to, daily in addition to assigned homework. Following is the minimum amount of time students at each grade level should be reading, or be read to, for homework:

- Kindergarten: No Homework except RAD books
- First and Second Grades: 15-30 minutes a night
- Third through Eighth grades: 30+ minutes a night

Lateness/Early Dismissal Policy

Please note that - other than for students who get breakfast - school begins and doors open at 8:21 a.m. and dismisses at 3:00pm for all students, except Kindergarten dismissing at 2:50pm. Students will be marked late if they arrive after 8:25am.

On inclement weather days, doors will open at 8:15 a.m. and students will be sent to class.

If a student arrives after 10am or leaves before 1pm, the student will be marked as half day unexcused.

Two unexcused half days will add up to a full day unexcused absence.

Attendance Policy

Students who are absent for illness or extenuating circumstances will have their absences excused. Absence notes can be written by hand and sent to the teacher or emailed to Wendy Gosfield our school secretary at wsgosfield@philasd.org within three days of the absence. If a child is absent, an automated voice message from the School District of Philadelphia will alert the parent of the absence.

It is important to understand the correlation between daily attendance and academic achievement. Please do your best to ensure that your child has prompt and daily school attendance.

Vacation

Taking family vacations when school is in session is strongly discouraged. Vacations will not be considered excused absences and will be marked as illegal absences.
